2nd Place Winner of \$3,000 (tie) OTTO Outwoul! Currently attending Texas A&M Health Science Center (TAMU Medical Program)

Otito grew up in Nigeria where he saw illnesses that plagued his family members and community. He was inspired to become a registered nurse to serve the medically and economically disadvantaged. Since high school, he has worked and paid for his education. During Covid, he worked closely with at risk communities and realized there is a shortage of healthcare workers.

Otito wrote in his scholarship application. "In order to accomplish this endeavor I made strides in advancing my education in the medical realm. I became a registered nurse and have worked with medically diverse communities in varying urban and rural cities across Texas. I have been working closely with at risk communities during COVID 19 while pursing a medical education. The covid-19 pandemic highlighted some already growing health care concerns. One issue in particular that resonated with me is, that there is a shortage of healthcare workers, especially those of color. As a minority healthcare worker I feel a sense of importance to establish more inclusion into my field for other minorities, and to also show those with disadvantaged backgrounds that they too can be in positions of autonomy, where they can help enrich lives. As a black physician I hope to reach the lives of others who also aspire to become a doctor.

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
